CAST OF CHARACTERS

(3 m, 3 w, 1 flexible)

JIM and CLARA HARPER: A young married couple who have just found their dream home.

CHRIS and ALLISON WINOWSKI: A competitive couple who are ready to move into "their" house.

ROGER and LUCY: Young couple.

DAVE (or RONA) CRAWFORD: (Flex.) Real estate agent and con artist.

SETTING

Can be as simple as a bare stage or an empty apartment. A small desk and chair for the real estate agent.

SOLD

(AT RISE: DAVE is showing ROGER and LUCY a house.)

DAVE: So, do you like what you see?

ROGER: Yes, absolutely.

DAVE: Just remember what I said before. This house has all the amenities anyone could ask for. A beautiful view, spacious rooms, large kitchen. Not to mention the nice, quiet neighborhood. Perfect for a young couple like you. Plus, the deal you'd get on it is a once-in-a-lifetime chance.

ROGER: Well, thank you for your time, Mr. Crawford. We'll keep in touch.

DAVE: Please do. This house won't be available for long.

(ROGER and LUCY exit as JIM and CLARA enter.)

CLARA: Oh wow, Jim! Look at this place!

DAVE: Good morning! I'm Dave Crawford, the real estate agent. How are you lovely young people doing today?

JIM: Fine, thank you.

CLARA: We were on our way to the park for a picnic and saw the open house sign out front.

JIM: Clara wanted to come in real quick and take a look around.

DAVE: You're lucky you came by when you did. This house just opened up on the market today, and we've already had many interested people stop by.

CLARA: With a house this amazing, it's no wonder.

DAVE: It is perfect, I must say. The beautiful view, spacious rooms, large kitchen. Plus, it's in a nice, quiet neighborhood. Perfect for a young couple like you.

JIM: Looks and sounds almost too good to be true.

DAVE: Well, I'll tell ya, with the once-in-a-lifetime deal that you'd get on this house today, it's definitely a dream come true. Too good to pass up I'd say.

CLARA: Thank you.

(DAVE crosses to CHRIS and ALLISON. They talk in pantomime as Jim and Clara talk.)

CLARA: (Cont'd.) So, Jim. Whaddya think? It's perfect for us, isn't it?

JIM: Oh, yes. It's perfect for sure.

CLARA: Why so sarcastic? Don't you think it's perfect?

JIM: It's perfect all right. I just know that the deposit alone would be more than my whole life is worth.

CLARA: Oh, don't be such a grouchy pants. He said the deal we could get on this house is a once-in-a-lifetime chance.

JIM: I'm sure he says that to everybody. He's only trying to sell the house. Just think about the monthly payments. We could never afford it.

CLARA: But Jim, think about our future. Our family. Our kids.

JIM: What kids?

CLARA: The kids that we'll have someday.

JIM: Kids?

CLARA: Yes. Don't you know? First comes love, then comes marriage, then comes...well, you know the rest.

CLARA: Jim!

CLARA: Maybe we could find a way. You said we could almost afford it.

JIM: No, I believe I said it was a good deal, but that we could never afford it.

CLARA: Are you sure? Because I remember when we got married, you said you would do anything for me.
